Thank you to all of you who helped make the ordination of Lukas to the diaconate such a wonderful celebration. “Boy did it get hot in the church that night.”

This has been a good year for the church of Calgary, a number of young men and women have answered God’s call and this is a very good thing. The Gospel today reminds us that the harvest is plentiful but there is always a need for more workers. And there are workers out there; we just need to help them discern the call.

It makes total sense that young girls would want to grow up to have babies and that young men see themselves growing up to be dads. They want to be like their parents. But how well do we support the alternatives in life? Do we teach our children to pray and ask for God’s guiding hand to show them the way?

A friend, from my old business days, asked me how I feel about not leaving a legacy behind me. No children to carry on my name, no one to tell stories about me, who would remember me? Who will carry on my genes, my charm, my good looks, my grumpiness? I think the world will not miss my charm or good looks or even my grumpiness but I am sure that years from now people will still talk about me.

Still none of that is the important stuff. The important stuff is standing before the power of God and answering for the use of the gifts God gave me. Did I use them well in answer to God’s call?

All of us have been called into the harvest, some to plant, some to weed, some to provide shelter, some to provide food, some to provide clothing, but all have been called to help in the harvest.

After 11 years of ordination I can tell you one thing, the work is not going to get done by itself!
